

Hymns

"Womb of Life and Source of Being" is a text by Ruth Duck. Ruth Duck (b. 1947) is a noted hymn writer, best known for her skilled use of inclusive language in both hymnody and worship. An *emerita* professor at Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary, Duck has authored several published resources that offer practical and theological strategies for the use of inclusive language. The tune, *Raquel*, was composed by Skinner Chavez-Melo, an organist, conductor and composer who was music director at the St. Rose of Lima Roman Catholic Church in Manhattan. Mr. Chavez-Melo was born in Mexico City, but completed his musical studies in the United States, receiving degrees at Eastern Nazarene College and the Union Theological Seminary, and pursuing further studies at the Juilliard School and the Manhattan School. He toured internationally as an organist and conducted orchestras in Mexico, Brazil, and the United States. As a composer, he wrote works for organ, choir and orchestra, and contributed hymn settings to several published hymnals, including those of the United Church of Christ and Yale University. He also lectured and presented workshops on Hispanic church music. He died of spinal cancer in 1992.

"O God, We Bear the Imprint of Your Face" is a hymn-text by Shirley Erena Murray and first published in 1987, where it is entitled "A Hymn About Racism." Born in Invercargill, New Zealand, Ms. Murray was educated in the classics, French, and music at Otago University and became a teacher of languages. She has written poems and satirical songs as well as hymns. The tune, Song 1, is by Orlando Gibbons and first appeared in 1623. Gibbons was born at Oxford and was a chorister at King's College. He served as organist at the Chapel Royal and later at Westminster Abbey.

"Help Us Accept Each Other," by Fred Kaan, was inspired by a Bible study written for the Cumberland Presbyterian Church. Kaan served as a staff member at the World Alliance of Reformed Churches. The tune, *Baronita*, was composed by Doreen Potter in 1975 especially for this text. The hymn was used by Church Women United in the 1983 World Day of Prayer service.
