# Happening at First Presbyterian Church

First Pres is grateful to be able to continue **in-person worship**. If you're joining us in-person, please wear a mask, use sanitizer, and maintain social distancing. We ask everyone to wear masks so that those who are unable to be vaccinated are protected while we are together.

On **Wednesday**, **May 25** at 2:00 and 7:00 p.m., all are invited to attend a **Grief Gathering** in Fellowship Hall. These sessions are offered to anyone who is grieving the death of Rev. Kevin Fleming and would appreciate some support. These gatherings are an informal opportunity to talk with Pastors John and Wendy, Jerusha Van Camp, and others about your grief and receive care.

The First Pres Session continues to monitor local pandemic conditions and modify our **COVID safety protocols** as conditions warrant. Beginning next **Sunday**, **May 22**, mask wearing will be *recommended*, but not required in our building. Both worship spaces will have designated areas for those who need to continue to take precautions. The Session will continue to provide and encourage the use of masks, sanitizer, and social distancing, for good public health and so we may continue to offer a safe place to those who are vulnerable.
