From the Pastor

Dear Friends,

I want to thank you for your active participation in the book study. I've been hearing that there have been good ideas coming out of the discussions. Once the study is done, the Session will compile the ideas and then the committees will discuss how they can implement some of those ideas now or in the future. The finalized compilation will also be something the PNC can show prospective pastoral candidates when talking about the direction the congregation is interested in going in.

I hope you will choose to continue to meet during October for discussion on Generosity - the giving of our time, talent, and material resources to the glory of God. The discussions will be based on a daily devotional that will be sent to your email or will be available to be sent to you, if you're not a computer person. The theme of this year's Generosity Campaign is "For where your treasure is, there will be your heart will be also" (Matt. 6:21). Also, Paul tells us that "...the fruit of the Spirit is...kindness, goodness, faithfulness..." (Gal. 5:22). We will explore all of this more through our discussions and sermons during October. Again, I believe these discussion are important, not just in thinking about the financial needs of the church, but in what ways your gifts of time and talents might be used to benefit this congregation or the ministries First Pres is involved in within the community and beyond.

I also hope that these discussions will create in you a desire to participate in more study groups. There will be an Advent study in December, and next year a Lenten study. Other studies being planned include a writing group to explore your life moments with God, healing spiritual hurts, and a delve into prayer. More about these groups will be forthcoming in the next couple of newsletters.

Pastor Nominating Committee - Moving Forward

The Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) has been formed, and we're in the middle of the congregation-wide book study, so what happens next in our journey forward?

The PNC will soon be able to get to work, but first they have to first meet with our Executive Presbyter, Susan McGee, which will happen in November. At the same time, Session will be finishing the tasks they need to accomplish in making some important decisions in regard to the details in calling a pastor. The PNC will then be able to begin their work by mid-November. Their first order of business will be writing what is called a Ministry Information Form, which tells about the church, what we believe, the work the church is involved in and hopes to be involved in, and what gifts, talents, and experiences they are looking for in a new pastor. Once that is written, it needs to be approved by the Committee on Ministry at Presbytery. It will next go to Presbyterian Leadership Connection in Louisville where computer-generated matches will made and sent to the PNC. Hopefully, that work will be complete by February or March. Once the matches come back, the work of discussion and discernment begins as the PNC goes through the Pastor Information Forms and decides who to interview. Please be patient and continue to pray for the PNC and the potential candidates. This is not a quick process. You will continue to get periodic updates as the process moves forward.
