There is SO MUCH TO SAY

But I'm going to start with three kinds of thanks:

- 1) Thank you all for an amazing two months. I couldn't be more delighted with the start that I've had as your pastor. So many of you have reached out, sent cards, and connected with me in numerous ways. Murray and I are both filled with gratitude for the welcome we've received and the sense of belonging we already feel. In addition to the amazing elders on Session, the conscientious and caring deacons, the talented and committed musicians and dedicated committee and team members, you have a stellar staff. I couldn't be happier with the way our work is unfolding.
- 2) **Thank you** for your ongoing support of this congregation through the generosity campaign. As we've explored the theme "Rooted in Faith ~ Growing to Serve," sixty-five of you have stepped up to pledge \$355,298 to date. As we watch for another 20 or so individuals or families to turn in their pledges (and possibly have some new folks pledge for the first time) we are well on our way to \$431,000 (which is the amount we need to reach to move forward with a budget similar to 2024.) I'm confident that we can do it. If any of you have resources you've been thinking about gifting First Presbyterian Church (stock certificates, bonds, properties) this December would be a great time to do that.
- 3) **Thank you** for your willingness to adapt and adjust to some new ways of doing things. I realize that anytime things change it can be uncomfortable while people get used to the differences. I am doing my best to listen and observe, and to approach things with curiosity. It is interesting to hear your stories about why certain things are (or have been) done in certain ways. It is also interesting to hear the different versions of answers to my curiosities! This will be a year of figuring each other out. This will be a year of learning about each other and the ways we can best work together. I'm incredibly excited about our potential.

This leads me to three challenges:

- 1) Attend in person OR online as often as possible. Simply showing up (in person or online) is foundational to the work we need to do together. The Church in the world is changing. We are not going back to the 50s or the 70s or the 90s or the 2010s. We can only move forward. This means that we will have to reimagine many of the things that we are used to doing. Some things need to be transformed, some things need to continue, some things need to rest.
- 2) If you are a leader (or if you have been a leader) please take care of yourselves. You have moved with grace and strength through nearly five years of dramatic change and loss. It is okay to be tired. It is okay to still be grieving. It is okay to be excited about new possibilities. It is okay to feel all of the things at once! It is normal to not be able to identify exactly what you are feeling as we begin this work together. So if you need to take a break from leadership - take a break. If you are ready to continue - please do! If you have been on the sidelines for a bit and are ready to re-engage, let me know. The nominating committee is getting a late start this year, but I feel sure that the right people for the positions that are open will say 'yes' when asked. Again, reach out to me so we can talk about where you might get engaged in the ministry and mission of First Pres.
- 3) Continue to offer grace to each other (to the staff, to the volunteers, to the elders, to the deacons, to the teachers, to the youth, to the children, to the older members, to everyone!) Let's make this first year together, this new Church year and this upcoming new calendar year one for the record books. As you offer grace, know that we need to practice receiving grace too.

Friends, I can't wait to see what God has in store for First Presbyterian Church of Evansville, Indiana. Let your neighbors and friends know that God is up to something here and they are welcome to join us on the journey. I'm praying for God's peace and presence to be with us all.

"Green" Tea!



Presbyterian Women invite all to the Green Tea on Sunday, December 15, after both services. Tea, punch, and a variety of snacks will be served in hopes that you will contribute some "folding green" to the **Independent Living Program** of the United Methodist Youth Home. The UMYH serves at-risk youth who have experienced abuse, neglect, truancy, lack of stability or guidance at home, or court-ordered placement.

The Independent Living Program prepares young people to live on their own as successful community members. They learn about cooking and nutrition, housekeeping and basic home maintenance, and budgeting and finance. They also acquire job readiness skills and explore career and higher education opportunities. As they transition to responsible adulthood, the Program can also provide help with bus tokens, groceries, transportation, and supplies and furnishings for their first home. Join us for fellowship, sweet treats, and an opportunity to nurture our community's youth.

Longest Night Service

Join us Saturday, December 21 at 4:30 p.m. for the Longest Night Service. We'll gather to acknowledge that the expansive darkness of this time of the year can complicate the way we experience the Advent and Christmas seasons. It is our hope that you experience God's love and comfort in the time we are together. Sunset is at 4:35 p.m. on December 21 so the candles we light will be welcome as the evening darkens.



While feelings of loss and grief are often associated with the loss of a loved one through death, it is important to remember that there are other sources of grief, sadness, or even fear: the loss of community connection due to the brokenness of partisan politics, the loss of a job or career (or meaningful work), the loss of a relationship, disconnection from family or friends, the loss of physical mobility or ability, the experience of chronic or potentially terminal illness, the loss of mental acuity through dementia or other illness, and so much more. We also know that some may come to this service to pray with and for others who are experiencing a difficult season; everyone is welcome.

All experiences of loss are important to God and worthy of our attention as a community of faith. You may participate in whatever way is meaningful for you. You may join in the responses and prayers or stay silent; you may sing or listen; you may come forward to light a candle or simply be still. Your presence is enough.




presence of children.

Introducing Jim McGill

In the Book of Acts, Luke tells us that Jesus' last words to his disciples before his ascension were: "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." - Acts 1:8

In other words: Take the Good News of Jesus Christ to the whole world.

Presbyterian Church (USA) Mission Co-workers today take this good news to many worldwide settings - not only in words, but also in deeds that demonstrate God's commitment to justice and well-being for all people.



Inspired and challenged by Transitional Pastor Anna Van Winkler's service as a Mission Co-worker in Cameroon, the Mission Committee has established a relationship of support with PCUSA Mission Coworker Jim McGill. Jim and his wife Jodi began their mission service in 1995 in Malawi. More recently, they have worked in Niger where Jodi served as a nursing and public health educator. She is now in the United States with their six children, but Jim remains in Africa working in the rural development of Niger and South Sudan. He partners with the Evangelical Church in the Republic of Niger, the largest Protestant church in a country which is 95% Muslim.

Jim is a facilitator for Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) Programs with a goal of ensuring sustainability for clean water and sanitation at both community and user levels. Niger and South Sudan are among the poorest countries in the world and reliable access to is key to their health and development.


Confirmation

Holiday Office Hours


