As we have new folks connecting with us in worship - both in person and online - on an almost weekly basis, I think it's important that we (and they) know who we are! In that spirit, here is this congregation's Vision Statement that was revised in March of 2016:

First Presbyterian Church in Evansville, Indiana, is called to embody God's love, made known in Jesus Christ, in life-giving ways, and to engage with God in transforming lives, communities, and institutions to reflect God's goodness. As a community of open-hearted disciples, we covenant to support and encourage one another as we explore God's grace on our journey of faith.

And this is our congregation's Statement on Inclusivity:



Convinced of God's Grace and Love, we affirm that there can be no exclusiveness in the worship of Christ. We welcome all regardless of race, ethnic heritage, national origin, age, gender, marital status, sexual orientation, or socio-economic standing. We encourage the full participation of all in the life of our congregation.

It is important in this moment (perhaps even more so now than in the past) that we are clear about who we are as a Presbyterian Church (USA) congregation who has chosen to fully embrace the rich tapestry of diversity among God's children (this pastor believes we are ALL God's children - even those among us who don't or can't believe) while working for equitable opportunities and experiences in the church, community and world. It is important that folks know we have chosen to privilege being a community whose hope is to *fully include all people* in this community of faith.

Friends, we have folks who are on the journey with us who aren't altogether sure about God (much less, Presbyterians or Reformed Theology!) and that is 100% good. We will never all be at the same point on life's journey. But we can journey together. That said, it is important for people to know that we are a community who chooses to love God and love others. We don't (and won't) do this perfectly, but we will strive to live into this congregation's vision for ministry and mission and this congregation's convictions about inclusion.


On April 14, the book will be *The Enchanted April* by Elizabeth von Arnim, a 1921 classic novel set in an Italian castle in Portofino.

First Light Doings

First Light, our youth group for Junior- and Senior- High aged students, meets most Sundays from 5:30 to 7:00 p.m. with Pastor MB. A <u>full schedule</u> of dates, topics, and events can be downloaded from the church website.

On April 27, the group will have an "Afternoon Away" at *High Score Player Two* on Mt. Vernon Ave.



FIRST LIGHT will officially happen (with adult supervision) from 1:30-3:30 p.m. Parents/guardians are responsible for transporting students to and from the arcade. We have reserved their Party Room for pizza and snacks (for everyone!) starting at 1:30 p.m. Admission is good for the whole day (11:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.), but parents/guardians are responsible for supervising their students if they arrive before and/or stay after the official meeting time.

Sign up using the form on First Web before Monday, April 21 to get an all-day pass for your student and one friend per student (additional passes for friends or family are \$12/person at the door). Passes will be provided for all youth who attend FPC Evansville for worship or who have participated in FIRST LIGHT Youth Group and who sign up by April 21. You can still decide at the last minute, but you may have to purchase your own pass when you arrive (\$12).

Be Still: Mindfulness and Christianity - Starting April 27

Be Still: Mindfulness and Christianity is a 4-week study group that will look at the benefits of mindfulness practice through the lens of Christianity. Mindfulness has been a buzzword in popular media for years, but in reality, humans have practiced mindfulness for millennia. This group will explore what mindfulness is (and isn't), what different religious traditions, including Christianity, have to say about it, and how incorporating mindfulness practice into daily life can deepen our spiritual lives. The group will be a mix of discussion and learning as well as "hands-on" practice. Additional reading and resources are available if desired but are not necessary to participate.

Potential topics include:

- Defining mindfulness What does the bible say about mindfulness? •
- · Mindfulness in the Christian tradition and in other religious traditions ·
- · Different ways to practice mindfulness · Benefits of mindfulness practice ·

• Related concepts of acceptance, curiosity, gratitude •

This discussion group will be led by Emma Nicholls, Ph.D., HSPP. Emma has been a practicing clinical psychologist for over 20 years, and mindfulness has been a part of her practice for most (if not all) of that time. She especially enjoys teaching these skills to children and youth in group settings.

What is Confirmation?

Confirmation is the sealing of the covenant (promise) made in baptism - if a student (grades 7 through 12) has not been baptized, they can ask to be baptized at any time or they can be baptized as part of their confirmation process. Basically, confirmation is an opportunity for students to profess their faith and to confirm their desire to become members of the church (if they choose to - some students choose to wait to 'officially' join the church.) Each student who wants to be confirmed will have several sessions with Pastor MB along with other students who wish to be confirmed. Students will be assigned a mentor (another adult member of the congregation) who will also connect with the student. Every adult who is part of this process will be background checked, and no students will meet with adults one-on-one; we will always connect in small groups.

Please contact Pastor MB (<u>mb@fpcevv.com</u> or 812-872-4882 voice or text) to let her know if you/your student wants to be baptized and/or participate in confirmation this spring. The dates and times will be tailored to the needs of the students who want to participate. These young people already belong to God - this is just a way to help them feel connected to the church in a more intentional way. There is no rush! We can also do this again in the fall or next spring.



Attention First Light High School Students: Summer Opportunity!

The Presbyterian Youth Triennium (PYT) is an ecumenical event hosted by the Presbyterian Church (USA) and the Cumberland Presbyterian Church that gathers high school age young people every 3 years. It is a well-planned and thoughtfully led event focused on worship, disciple making, Christian compassion & justice and biblical/theological education. It is also a catalyst for many young people to take the next steps in their faith. This year, it takes place in Louisville, Kentucky from July 21-28.

Youth Participants (YP) who are *entering freshmen through graduated seniors in high school* and are active in PC(USA) or Cumberland Presbyterian Church do not have to be official church members. Any students connected to our congregation are invited to go with the Presbytery of Ohio Valley delegation (led by Rev. Jerusha Van Camp) to worship, learn, fellowship, and play as a hopeful and joyful community of faith at the 2025 Presbyterian Youth Triennium. The experience will be one of those life-shaping, faith-forming events they will never forget! The 2025 and 2028 Trienniums will both be held in Louisville, Kentucky. The majority of PYT will take place at the Kentucky International Convention Center (KICC). Participants will stay at nearby, Triennium-designated hotels at special event rates.



The theme for this summer's Presbyterian Youth Triennium is "As *If We Were Dreaming.*" Dreams play an important role in the biblical narrative. It is often through dreams that God speaks to God's beloved. Sometimes it is a promise. Sometimes it is a warning. Always it is a reminder that we are not alone; God sees us and is with us. There is a passage in the Psalms where God's exiled people were all but without hope, wondering if God had forgotten them. But God restored their hope and brought them back home. The only way they could describe their experience was that it was "*as if we were dreaming.*"

For First Pres Youth who plan to participate in RSCM Midwest, you can do both! RSCM Midwest ends on Sunday, July 27 and Triennium begins in the afternoon on Monday, July 28.
