First Light First Sundays: July 6 & August 3, 5:30-7:00 p.m.




Our Middle and High School youth group, First Light, will meet on first Sundays of the month this summer!

Confirmation Class

CONFIRMATION CLASS for students entering grades 8 through high school will meet in the First Light room (Ed Wing #102) at 9:30 a.m. on Sundays July 6-August 17. Students who attend at least three Sunday mornings, who create a statement of faith (in any creative medium - written, art, music, drama, etc.), and who choose to request church membership will have the opportunity to meet with the Session the evening of Tuesday, August 19 (in person or on Zoom) or at a later date if needed to be received into membership. Rev. MB McCandless will lead most Sundays and Rev. Jerusha Van Camp will lead a few Sundays.



Be Still: Mindfulness and Christianity - Starting in July!

Be Still: Mindfulness and Christianity is a 4-week study group that will look at the benefits of mindfulness practice through the lens of Christianity. Mindfulness has been a buzzword in popular media for years, but in reality, humans have practiced mindfulness for millennia. This group will explore what mindfulness is (and isn't), what different religious traditions, including Christianity, have to say about it, and how incorporating mindfulness practice into daily life can deepen our spiritual lives. The group will be a mix of discussion and learning as well as "hands-on" practice. Additional reading and resources are available if desired but are not necessary to participate.

Topics may include:

- Defining mindfulnessWhat does the Bible say about mindfulness?
- Mindfulness in the Christian tradition and in other religious traditions •
- Different ways to practice mindfulness Benefits of mindfulness practice
 - Related concepts of acceptance, curiosity, gratitude

This discussion group will be led by Emma Nicholls, Ph.D., HSPP. Emma has been a practicing clinical psychologist for over 20 years, and mindfulness has been a part of her practice for most (if not all) of that time. She especially enjoys teaching these skills to children and youth in group settings.

SUNDAY EVENINGS with YOUTH




