The items needed are (please purchase new items as described): scouring pads (not stainless steel nor soap pads)


- sponges (small and large)

- N95 dust masks Heavy-duty/multi-use dishwashing gloves (latex-
- free preferred)
- 30 to 45 gallon heavy duty/contractor-type trash bags


