






This Sunday

This is the final Sunday of our Advent Waiting Well series. (It's almost Christmas!) We will take a look at the Matthew text where Joseph goes from deciding to quietly get out of his engagement to Mary (hoping to help both of them to avoid embarrassment) to receiving a message from an angel that affirms her story about the child to naming the child Jesus. The message, *Don't Drop the Baby*, tries to answer this question: "How do we deal with urgent situations that arise while we are waiting on something we are confident will happen?"



Congregational Meeting - this Sunday






One Worship December 28
