GOSPEL READING

Matthew 14:13-21

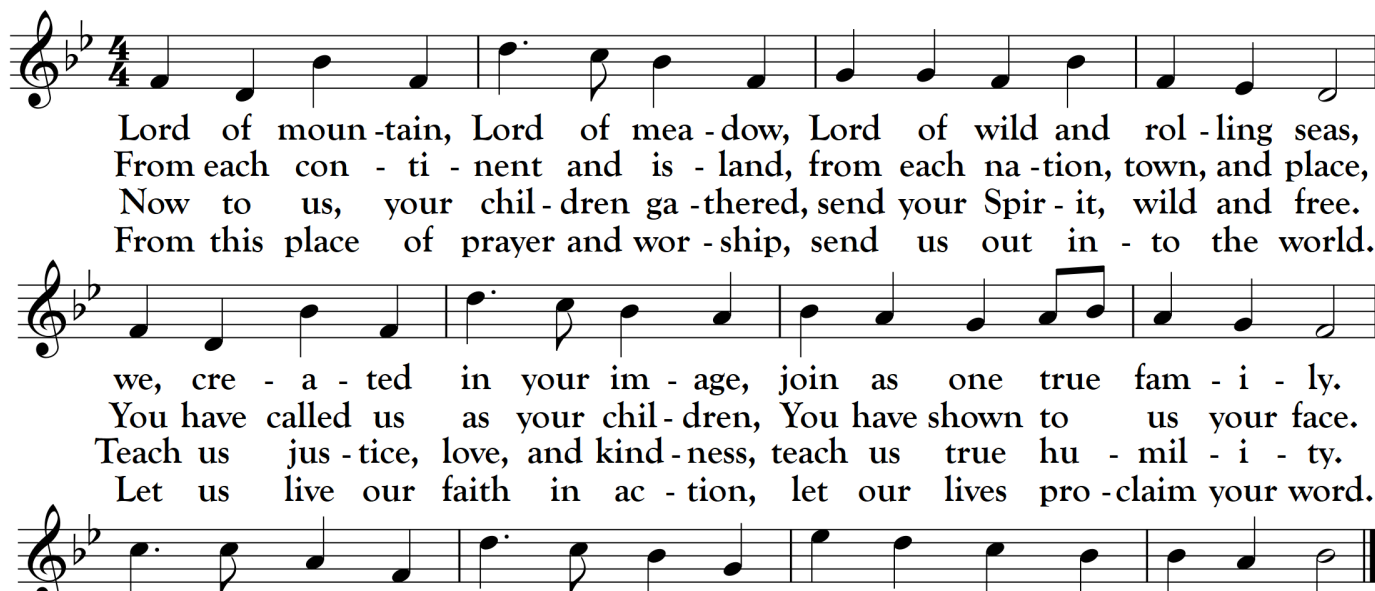
